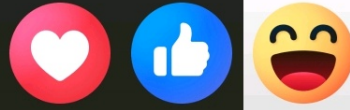

TRANSFERRED EPITHET

Definition: Transferred epithet is a figure of speech in which an adjective is shifted from the person or thing it truly describes to another noun connected with it.

..... ✦

Detailed Explanation: The quality really belongs to one thing, but it is grammatically attached to another for style, emphasis, or poetic effect.

Examples:

- He spent a *sleepless* night.
- She walked along the *lazy* road.
- We heard the *cheerful* song of the birds.
- He sat in the *restless* classroom.
- She gave me an *anxious* glance.

Quick Tip:
The adjective is transferred from the real doer or feeler to a related noun. ✧

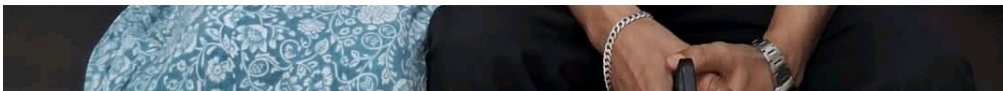

SYLLEPSIS

Definition: Syllepsis is a figure of speech in which one word is used with two others in different senses or meanings at the same time.

..... ✦

Explanation: The same governing word works in two ways, often one literal and one figurative, making the sentence clever and compact.

..... ✦

Examples:

- He lost his coat and his temper.
- She opened the door and her heart.
- He caught a fish and a cold.
- She blew out the candle and his hopes.
