GENERAL RULES FOR ADMISSION TO UNDER GRADUATE CLASSES:

1. Admission will be made on the recommendation of admission committee.
2. Admission will be strictly on fulfillment of eligibility conditions.
3. An applicant with a gap of one or more years in studies will have to submit an undertaking /affidavit citing the reason(s).
4. An applicant must produce original certificates at the time of counseling/admission.
5. All admissions will be provisional subject to the approval of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.
6. All terms and conditions of the admission and fee structure can be changed or modified as per the direction of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.
7. Applicants who have passed their qualifying examination other than Himachal Pradesh Board of School Education, Dharamshala must submit migration certificate in original.
8. Every student seeking admission in any class will be required to pay Parent Teacher Association (PTA) Fund as mentioned in the prospectus.
9. Girls students seeking exemption from tuition fee must submit/upload attested copy of Himachal Pradesh Bonafide certificate.
10. Students seeking concession from tuition fees for disability must submit/upload an attested copy of minimum 40% or above disability certificate from competent authority.
11. No such student will be admitted to B.A./B.Com./ B.Sc. Ist semester who has been placed under compartment or failed in 10+2 examination.
12. Applicant must submit/upload original character certificate obtained from institution last attended (not earlier than six month). In case of gap after 10 + 2 applicant must submit original character certificate (last institution attended) along with latest original character certificate issued by competent authorities like Pradhan Gram Panchayat/Class-I (Gazetted) Officer, etc.
13. Change of course or stream shall be allowed within 15 days from the commencement of classes.
14. No admission, whatsoever, shall be made after the due date.
15. Student must make payments of all dues in times.
16. Student must be regular in his/her attendance
17. Student must not take part in any kind of activity that would disturb and tarnish the academic ecosystem of the college.

REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

1. An applicant expelled by any college/University or found involved in any indisciplinary activities in the preceding year(s) shall not be admitted in the college.
2. Any applicant who has not studied and passed English as a subject at 10+2 level shall not be eligible for admission to B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. 1st semester.
3. If the applicant gets admission by furnishing incorrect/false information or by concealing the facts, his/her admission will be cancelled at any stage on the detection of such fault by the college/University.
4. In spite of the eligibility for the admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during previous years.
5. The Principal reserves the right to reject or cancel the admission of the student without assigning any reason or explanation if circumstances warrant so at any stage.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO B.A./B.COM./B.SC. PASS COURSE

1. **B.A. Pass Course:** Provided that the student who has passed +2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto, accepted as equivalent by various bodies of H.P. University with 33% marks (including English). The students opting for Mathematics as one of the subjects of study must have 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level. However, a student who has passed qualifying examination in Arts stream will be given preference in B.A. programme.

2. **B.Com. Pass Course:** The minimum eligibility condition for a student to get admission in B.Com. is 33% marks at +2 level. The candidates opting for Commerce from other streams must have passed Mathematics/Economics as compulsory subjects at +2 level with a minimum of 45% marks in respective subject/s and 40% in aggregate. However, a student who has passed qualifying examination in Commerce stream will be given preference in B. Com. programme.
3. **B.Sc. Pass Course:** Provided that the student who has passed +2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto, accepted as equivalent by various bodies of H.P. University with 45 % marks in five subjects (three Science subjects, English & one optional). For admission in B.Sc. medical, student must have passed +2 examination with Biology, Chemistry & Physics & for B.Sc. Non Medical, student must have passed +2 examination with Chemistry, Mathematics & Physics and English & one optional subject. However, a student who has passed qualifying examination in Science stream will be given preference in B.Sc. programme.
4. A student who has passed Shastri, Prak Shastri from a Sanskrit College affiliated to H.P. University or Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University) under MHRD, Govt. of India, shall be eligible for admission to Arts stream only, provided the candidate has passed Prak Shastri or Shastri with English as one of the subjects.
5. All the admissions in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. programme will be made on the merit of +2 examination, taking into consideration the best five subjects including English as one of the subject.
6. The students placed under compartment or failed in +2 examination are not eligible for admission to the college.
7. Admission against quota meant for outstanding students in sports and cultural activities, shall be made only once in the beginning of the session. These students must also qualify the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in that course as provided under rules.
8. Only those students will be considered for Sports quota who have participated in international/ National/ State/District Level Tournaments (or secured positions).
9. Only those students who have participated in cultural events at National/State/District Level will be considered for the quota meant for outstanding students in cultural activities.
10. It will be mandatory for the students admitted against Sports and Cultural quotas to participate in sports/cultural events.

Age Criteria (Upper Age Limit)

- An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years in case of girl students) as on July 1, 2026. A relaxation of 3 years is applicable to candidates belonging to SC/ST category.
- The Vice-Chancellor, HPU may, in exceptional cases/circumstances, to be recorded in writing, give relaxation in age up to a maximum of 6 months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval to the Vice-Chancellor by 31st October of every academic year.
- Relaxation in upper age limit is admissible to physically challenged candidates also.

Note: ● All admissions made by the college are provisional till regularized by H.P. University.
● University ordinance shall be strictly adhered to for admission to all classes.

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR ADMISSION (ORDINANCE 3.14)

The college follows the reservation policy of H. P. Government adopted by H. P. University in admissions. The following reservations are in accordance with the reservation roster of H. P. University:

Scheduled Caste (SC):	15%
Scheduled Tribe (ST):	7.5%
Sports (SP):	5%
Cultural Activities (CUL):	5%
Persons with Disability (PwD):	5%
Economically Weaker Section (EWS):	10% (Additional)

These reservations will be applicable to those who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or from any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh or bonafide residents of Himachal Pradesh. Seats under Sports and Cultural quotas will be allotted to those students who have participated in events recognized by HPU Sports and Co-Curricular Council. For seat reservation, the following roster will be followed:

Academic Components of the Programme Under NEP 2020

The Undergraduate Programme shall comprise the following curricular components:

1. Discipline Specific Courses (DSC) – Core / Major Courses
 2. Discipline Specific Electives (DSE) – Advanced Major Electives
 3. Minor Courses (MC) – Supporting Discipline Courses
 4. Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) – Interdisciplinary Courses
 5. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) – Skill and Employability Courses
 6. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) – Language / Communication Courses
 7. Value Addition Courses (VAC) – Ethics, Values, and Social Responsibility Courses
 8. Internship / Apprenticeship / Project / Community Outreach (I/A/P/C) – Experiential Learning Component
- The prescribed credit load in each course shall include lecture, tutorial, and practical components, wherever applicable.

Course Selection Guidelines and Instructions Under NEP-2020

The following academic rules shall govern course selection:

- I. The prescribed credit weightage shall include Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
- II. In the first semester, students shall be offered three different subjects of the same stream: A, B, and C.

- III. At the end of the second semester, and from the third semester onward, students may choose either the Multi-Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary programme or the Single Major programme. A student opting for the Single Major programme shall be required to declare his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester, and such choice shall continue up to Semester VIII.
- IV. Another discipline's Discipline Specific Course (DSC) studied during the first two semesters by students opting for a Major programme shall be treated as the Minor discipline.
- V. A DSC offered in one discipline shall be treated as a Minor by another discipline. Students may choose Minor courses from two different subjects, but shall be required to earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
- VI. Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDCs) shall be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than the Major and Minor subjects.
- VII. AEC/VAC/SEC-3 shall be chosen from a pool of courses. Each discipline shall provide such courses, some of which may be discipline-specific, while the remaining may be open to students of other disciplines. However, the two Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC-1 and SEC-2) shall be chosen from the discipline-specific pool (Core and Minor).
- VIII. A maximum of two language courses may be opted for under Core and Minor. Ability Enhancement Courses (AECs) shall be of a language other than that studied under DSCs/Minors.
- IX. Internship / Apprenticeship / Project / Community Outreach (I/A/P/C) shall be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to undertake such activities during the winter vacation.
- X. To pursue a four-year Honours degree, a student shall study one discipline in which he/she has completed at least 11 Core Courses (6 DSCs + 5 DSEs) in the first three years.
- XI. A student securing 75% or more marks in aggregate up to Semester VI (for a three-year degree) shall be eligible for admission to the four-year Honours with Research programme, subject to approval of the college by HPU to offer the same.
- XII. One course per semester under DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC, etc., from a subject offered in two (or more) different programmes (e.g., BCA and B.Sc./BPA and BA/BFA and BA/Shastri and BA, etc.) must be common.
- XIII. Students of the B.A. programme may opt for only one Discipline Specific Course in the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance/Music, Vocal & Instrument/Tabla etc.) and Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture etc.).
- XIV. To pursue an Honours degree in the fourth year, students shall choose only one discipline in both semesters, in which he/she has studied five DSEs in the first three years.
- XV. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfillment of the following conditions: Major – 64/84 credits (3/4 years) and Minor – 28 credits (4 years) in one subject/discipline.
- XVI. **As this scheme is being introduced for the first time, it is subject to modifications. Any changes applied in subsequent years after admission to the 1st Year shall be retrospectively applicable.*

ADMISSION PROCEDURE (B.A./B.Com/B.Sc.) 1st Semester

Guidelines and General Instructions:

- The candidates seeking admission to 1st semester should apply on the prescribed form available online on college website gcbarsar.ac.in
- The candidates can approach the college office or convener of admission committee in case they find any difficulty in filling up of the admission form during the college hours.
- Students applying for admission to 1st semester shall give preference of three subjects/courses of choice **as mentioned in the subject combination table** .
- The merit list will be displayed on college website and notice board as per schedule mentioned in the prospectus.
- After approval of admission form by admission committee, applicants are advised to deposit their fee online within stipulated period mentioned in the prospectus.
- A candidate who fails to deposit the fee/dues by the scheduled date and time shall forfeit **his /her right to admission and the seat shall be offered to the next student in the merit list for which the notices will be displayed on the notice board and official website accordingly** .
- In case of a tie, the candidate older in age shall be given weightage.
- Incomplete admission forms and those without hard copies (at the time of counseling/ when demanded by office) of uploaded documents will not be entertained.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO BE UPLOADED WITH ONLINE APPLICATION FORM

- Passport size photograph.
- Copy of self attested Matriculation certificate.
- Copy of self attested 10+2 certificate.
- Copy of Original Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended or character certificate issued by a Gazetted Officer in case of a private or gap candidates. The character certificate should not be issued earlier than 6 months prior to the date of admission.
- Copy of self attested category certificate issued by competent authority for availing benefit of reservation in case of SC/ST candidates, if applicable.
- Self attested copy of Bonafide Himachali Certificate for the exemption of Tuition Fee (for girl students).
- A documentary evidence/declaration as the proof of activities for the period of gap in the academic career.
- An Equivalence Eligibility Certificate from H.P. Board/University for the candidates who have passed +2 from a Board other than H.P. Board of School Education/ I.C.S.E./C.B.S.E.
- Self attested copy of original Migration certificate for the candidates who have passed from Board/University other than the H.P. Board of School Education /H.P. University.
- Self attested copy of Aadhaar card.
- Self attested copy of sports/ cultural activities at international/National/State/District level.
- Self attested copy of Economic Weaker Section (EWS) certificate (valid for current financial year), if applicable.

- Self Attested copy of Person with Disability (PwD) certificate issued by competent authority (40% or above disability), if applicable.
- Self Attested copy of Bank Account proof (Pass Book).
- Self Attested copy of Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry (APAAR) ID.

Note:

- Admission without any of the above-mentioned documents shall be purely provisional and at the candidate's own risk.
- The candidate must produce all his/her original certificates for verification when demanded by the Admission Committee/College Office as and when notified.
- Students must furnish the college with their latest valid Aadhaar ID, Email ID and Mobile Number.

ADMISSIONS AND COURSE GUIDELINES FOR B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com. 2nd & 3rd YEAR

- Admission to the above classes shall also be online and on Roll-on basis as per the date/s notified by the University(mentioned in the prospectus). Under Roll-on system, the student who has taken the examination of 1st and 2nd year in the previous session is allowed to take provisional admission in the next class i.e. in 2nd and 3rd year respectively, without waiting for the final result.
- Roll-on provisional admission to the next class will be regularised only if the student is declared pass or placed under compartment.
- However, these students will have to fulfill all the formalities of admission laid down by the college authorities within the stipulated date and time.
- Major course **once chosen allotted in first year ,cannot be changed in 2nd or 3rd year.**
- The students getting admission in 2nd year will have to study two Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC- 1 & SEC-2) of major course & Compulsory English/MIL in B.A./B.Com.
- The students seeking admission in B.A./B.Com. 3rd year will have to study the Discipline Specific Elective (DSE-1, DSE-2) courses in the major subject studied earlier, SEC-3 and SEC-4 in major subject and two courses of Generic Elective (GE-1 & GE-2) of an unrelated subject/discipline, other than DSE-1 & DSE-2.
- The students of B.Sc. 3rd year will have to study the two DSE courses in the subjects/disciplines selected earlier and SEC-3, SEC-4 in the major subject.

Note: All the candidates are directed to strictly adhere to the timeline prescribed by the H.P. University.

Examination & Grading Under NEP 2020

1. Registration of Students

Every eligible student admitted to the college shall be required to get registered with the University. Registration process of students will be as per the University Ordinance or Notification issued from time to time. The process of registration has to be completed within one month after the admission. No student shall be allowed to appear in the exam in the private capacity.

2. Examinations

Every student after fulfilling the requisite conditions shall be allowed to fill in the examination form, which will be duly verified by the college.

2.1 Filling of Examination Form

University shall be notifying the schedule to fill in the examination form and will give at least 15 days. After the prescribed date, University shall allow to fill in the examination form with late fee as per the University Norms

3. Evaluation

Evaluation will be based on Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE), End - Semester Examination (ESE) and Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc., which will contribute to the final grade. ESE will consist of written examination at the end of the semester which will be conducted by the University.

The semester examination may have the following components:

1. Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE)
2. End Semester Examination (ESE)
3. Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc. if any

3.1 Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE)

- i. CCE marks obtained by students will be uploaded through online mode only. Copy of the original award list of CCE, duly signed by the concerned teacher and verified by the Principal, will be submitted to the University before the result declaration.
- ii. Before entering online CCE marks, the marks list will be displayed on college Notice Board. Students' grievances, if any, may be resolved by the college authority.
- iii. In case a student fails to clear CCE due to House Test/Class Test and/or Assignment/Presentation and/or Practical etc, he/she shall be given additional two chances prior to commencement of ESE to qualify CCE.
- iv. If a student fails to clear the Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) even after availing all permissible chances in a particular course, he/she shall be required to redo the CCE in the subsequent semester.
- vi. The relaxation in Attendance and condonement of Shortage of Attendance if any shall be governed by the existing norms of H. P. University.

3.2 End Semester Examination (ESE)

1. Each academic year shall comprise two semesters, viz. Odd and Even semesters. Odd Semesters' 4 Examinations and Grading-(NEP-2020)-Himachal Pradesh University examination will be held in October and the Even Semesters' examination will be held in April.
2. Minimum attendance requirement for appearing in ESE is 75%. A student having less than 75% attendance in aggregate will not be eligible to appear in the End- Semester Examination (ESE).

3. Only those students will be allowed to appear in the examination whose admit card has been generated and roll numbers are appearing in the cut-list.
4. A student shall be promoted from the 1st Year to the 2nd Year upon passing at least 50% of the total credits offered in the 1st Year. Similarly, a student shall be promoted from the 2nd Year to the 3rd Year upon passing at least 50% of the total credits offered in the first two years taken together. Promotion from 3rd year to 4th year shall be allowed when student successfully qualifies all the courses of the first three years.
5. If a student does not take admission in a semester, he/she will not be promoted to the next semester and student will have to take fresh admission again in the same semester in the next academic session.
6. If a student does not take admission and fills online examination form, he/she shall not be permitted to appear in the ESE examination and the online examination form if filled by such a student will be rejected. The examination fee thus submitted will not be adjusted/ refunded in any case.
7. A student who fails to pass the End Semester Examination (ESE) in any course(s), or is unable to appear in the ESE for any reason, despite fulfilling all other conditions (including the uploading of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) marks online), shall be treated as 'FAIL/ABSENT". Such a student shall be permitted to appear in the ESE of the concerned course(s) in the corresponding odd or even semester respectively, within the maximum prescribed duration examination.
8. In courses having theory and practical components, the student shall be allowed to reappear only in the failed component(s).
9. Students who could not appear or fail in one or more courses in End Semester Examination (ESE) shall be allowed to appear for the same as per the odd and even exam schedule. The examination schedule is elaborated as follows:
 First, third, fifth, seventh, ninth semester with odd semester examination schedule (Oct.).
 Second, fourth, sixth, eighth, tenth with even semester examination schedule (April).

3.3 Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc.

The Principal of the college shall ensure the completion of Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc., if any as per the schedule notified by the University. Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc. marks shall be entered through online mode before the ESE or not later than 10 days after the completion of ESE.

4. Conduct of Examinations

College shall conduct examinations for their students by providing all requisite facilities as per the University norms

- i. Centre Superintendent/Deputy Superintendent shall be appointed by the affiliating university preferably from other college/institution.
- ii. Appointment of invigilators (Teachers only) and supporting staff in the examination centres shall be made as per the University norms.
- iii. Senior Superintendent/Superintendent of the examination centre shall ensure requisite facilities for differently abled students.
- iv. It is the responsibility of the Senior Superintendent/Superintendent of the examination centre to regularly visit the University website on day-to-day basis for changes in the date sheet, cut list of the candidates etc.
- v. To conduct the examinations smoothly, flying squad shall be constituted by the University to inspect examination centres.
- vi. If any college/institutions fail to ensure fair conduct of examinations as per norms, University may cancel the examination centre or penalize for the anomalies.
- vii. Any grievances related to questions may be addressed to Assistant Registrar (Secrecy) through Senior Superintendent of that examination centre.

5. Evaluation process of End Semester Examination (ESE)

- Mode of evaluation may be as follows:
 On Screen Evaluation. By setting up of Cluster Evaluation Centres.
 On Spot evaluation by setting up of Evaluation Centres.
 Evaluation at concerned college
 Any other mode decided by the University
- Evaluation of Value Addition Course (VAC) shall be done in the concerned college or as per the decision taken by the University from time to time.
- To ensure timely declaration of results the Controller of Examinations in consultation with the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor/Pro Vice Chancellor, may adopt any of the aforementioned modes of evaluation.
- The Rules and Regulations for evaluation will be as per the guidelines issued by the University from time to time.
- All the Answer Scripts will be submitted to the University by the respective college/centre/cluster after the completion of evaluation process, irrespective of the mode of evaluation.
- Any delay in uploading awards of CCE/ ESE/Practical/I/A/P/C etc. from the given timelines may lead to disciplinary action against erring evaluator or Head of college/institution.

6. Course-Wise Credits and Division of Marks

Credits

The term 'credit' refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in terms of the instructional hours per week assigned to it.

For the purpose of credit determination, instruction is divided into three components:

Lectures (L)- Class room lectures.

Tutorials (T)- Special, elaborate instructions on specific topics (from Lectures)

Practicals (P)- Laboratory or field exercises in which the student has to do experiments or other practical work.

$$C = L + T + P$$

Where, C is the credit weightage for a particular course.

6.6 Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs)

Student will have the option to earn credits by completing quality-assured Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) through SWAYAM portal or any other source duly approved by University. The list of subjects to be opted by the students through SWAYAM portal will be available on the University website. The earned credits through SWAYAM are transferable to student's programme. Full details of implementing (MOOCs) through SWAYAM are as per the guidelines for implementation and adoption of SWAYAM /MOOCs in H.P. University. Student can earn a maximum of 40% of the total credits through SWAYAM /MOOCs in the entire programme. For more details, refer the MOOCs guidelines of Himachal Pradesh University

7. Passing Criteria

1. In order to pass in a course, following passing criteria is required:

- a. Passing percentage in ESE: 35%
- b. Passing percentage in CCE: 35%
- c. Passing percentage in Practical/Viva-Voce etc.: 35%
- d. Passing percentage in Aggregate: 40%
- e. Passing marks in I/A/P/C/Research/Dissertation: 35% minimum in each individual component and 40% in Aggregate.
- f. Passing marks in accredited online courses: In accordance with Swayam/MOOCs guidelines.

2. If a subject does not have a practical component: Student will have to pass both the components (i.e. CCE and ESE) separately and also in aggregate to become eligible to be declared successful in a subject.
3. If a subject has a Practical/Dissertation/*Viva-Voce* etc. component: Student will have to pass all the components (i.e. CCE and ESE and Practical/Dissertation/*Viva-Voce* etc.) separately and also in aggregate to become eligible to be declared successful in a subject.

7.1 Grace Marks

For calculating pass marks prescribed in these Ordinances for various examinations, every half mark or more shall be rounded off to the next higher whole number and shall be ignored if is less than half.

- (a) A candidate, who appears at an examination, but fails in one or more Course(s)/paper(s), (written, practical, sessional or *viva-voce*), and/or in the aggregate (if there is a separate requirement of passing in the aggregate), shall be given grace marks upto a maximum of one percent of the total aggregate marks allotted to the Course(s)/Paper(s)/ Subject(s), as the case may be, in which semester he has appeared to enable him to pass the said examination. While awarding grace marks the fraction working to half or more will be rounded off to the next whole number.

Provided further that grace marks up to a maximum of five may be awarded to a candidate who has failed only in one subject if it enables him to pass the entire examination.

Provided, however, that a candidate who is getting through with grace marks shall have an option not to avail of the benefit of grace marks. The application exercising such an option shall reach the Controller of Examinations within 30 days of the declaration of the concerned result and the Pro-Vice-Chancellor/ Vice- Chancellor will rectify such results and report such cases to the Academic Council in its next meeting.

- (b) At the time of completion of Degree Grace marks up to 1% of the total aggregate marks may be awarded to a candidate, who has passed an examination but has failed to obtain either the letter grade or the grade point etc.

8. Re-checking

- i. If a candidate feels that either some of the answers in his/her script have not been evaluated or there is a mistake in the totaling of marks awarded to him/her, he/she may apply for re-checking.
- ii. A student shall be entitled to re-checking of his answer sheet by filling the prescribed form and submitting the requisite fee within 21 days of the declaration of result.
- iii. If on re-checking a mistake is discovered, the mistake shall be rectified.

9. Re-Evaluation

- i. If a candidate feels that his script has not been fairly evaluated, he/ she may apply for reExaminations and Grading-(NEP-2020)-Himachal Pradesh University evaluation within 21 days of the declaration of result.

- ii. However, a candidate may be permitted to apply for re-evaluation after the expiry of 21 days but not later than the commencement of the succeeding semester, by depositing a late fee as decided by the university from time to time.
- iii. The University shall endeavour to declare the result of re-evaluation within one month and not later than two months.
- iv. The score on re-evaluation shall supersede the original score in case of a candidate securing more marks on original evaluation.
- v. If re-evaluation marks are less than the original marks, then re-evaluation marks will supersede the original marks but will not go lower than minimum passing marks in the paper concerned.
- vi. If the variation between originally evaluated awards and the awards of re-evaluation exceeds 10%, the answer sheet shall be sent for second re-evaluation and the average of the two higher awards shall be the final award. In such a case, the evaluator(s) may be asked to justify his evaluation.
- vii. The fraction of 0.5 or higher will be rounded off to the next whole integer.
- viii. Grace marks in re-evaluation will be allocated as per grace marks provision mentioned above under Grace Marks Rule.
- ix. Only that candidate who applies for re-checking and re-evaluation within the expiry of 21 days (i.e. without late fee) shall be entitled to claim any retrospective benefit such as admission/promotion to any course/class or eligibility to sit for the Medical College entrance test or the grant of Scholarship/award//medal/ Merit List/Gold Medal etc., on the basis of declaration of the result of re-checking and re-evaluation.
- x. No further re-assessment shall be allowed after the award/(s) by re-evaluators have been received.
- xi. Answer-scripts (Hard copy/Soft Copy) will be retained by the university only for one year from the date of declaration of results for all purposes unless they are required in connection with any case that is sub judice.

10. Determining Merit Positions/Ranking

1. Merit position (Top 10) will be generated at the end of the course on the basis of CGPA without considering candidates who have applied for re-appear; re-checking & reevaluation (only of those who apply after the expiry of 21 days); and improvement of division.
2. Tentative Merit position will be provided at the time of result declaration of final semester on the basis of CGPA.
3. The final Merit List will be generated after completing 30 days of the result declaration.

11. Conversion Formula

Conversion Formula for converting CGPA to Percentage is as follows: $\text{Percentage} = \text{CGPA} \times 10$.

12. Degree Completion Duration

- i. Regular student of affiliated colleges can complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years for Four-year Degree Programme and six years for Three-year Degree Programme. The gap between the semesters should not be more than three years as per academic session, subject to completion of the whole UG programme within seven years.
- ii. Students of CDOE can complete the degree programme as per the DEB guidelines (The maximum duration for completion and award of degree at the undergraduate and postgraduate Examinations and Grading- (NEP-2020)-Himachal Pradesh University levels or post graduate diploma in Open and Distance Learning mode and Online mode shall be double the minimum duration of the respective programmes) or as applicable from time to time. For e.g. B.A. degree of three years period shall be completed within six years.

13. Multiple Entry and Exit

The Rules and Regulation for Multiple Entry and Exit are as per the Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Himachal Pradesh University. Multiple entry and exit options under three-year degree programme with UG certificate/UG diploma/or degree depending upon the number of credits secured is as follows:

13.1 Re-entry

- i. A student can seek re-entry to the Degree Programme after exiting. However, the re-entry should be within a maximum gap period of three years after taking exit. Moreover, a student cannot stay out of a degree programme for more than three years in aggregate.
- ii. In addition, the Three-year and Four-year degree programmes have to be completed within the maximum stipulated period of six and seven years respectively. In any case, the gap between the exit and the re-entry into the UG programme should not be more than three years subject to completion of the whole UG three/four years programme within six/seven years respectively.
- iii. Re-entry may be within University i.e. between Colleges (shifting from one college to another depending upon the availability of seats), it may be called as Transfer of Admission (Inter-college migration) by taking consent from both the colleges and final approval by the University as per the rules of the University.
- iv. Re-entry may be from another University to this University or vice versa, it may be considered as Inter University Migration. The process of migration from one University to another University will be followed as per the University Ordinance Rules for Migration or Notification issued by the University from time to time.

14. Letter Grades and Grade Points

The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is computed from the grades as a measure of the student's performance in a given semester. The SGPA is based on the grades of the current term, while the Cumulative GPA (CGPA) is based on the grades in all courses taken after joining the programme of study. The University may also mention marks obtained in each course and a weighted average of marks based on marks obtained in all the semesters taken together for the benefit of students.

When students take audit courses, they may be given pass (P) or fail (F) grade without any credits.

15. Computation of SGPA and CGPA

The UGC recommends the following procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

- i The SGPA is the ratio of the sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e.

$$\text{SGPA (Si)} = \frac{\sum(C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where C_i is the number of credits of the i th course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i th course.

- ii. The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{\sum(C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

where S_i is the SGPA of the i th semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

NSS/NCC/ROVERS & RANGERS

I. To inculcate the qualities of leadership, social service, discipline and patriotism among the youths, the college is running NSS/Rovers and Rangers programmes in the college.

II. Presently the college has one NSS units comprising of 100 students. In this unit 33% seats are reserved for the girls. The students who attend 240 hours of social service and attend one 7 days special camp are given a special benefit of 2% marks at the time of admission to the H.P. University P.G. Courses.

III. At present the college has one wing of NCC (Army). There are 27 seats out of which 15 seats are for boys and 12 seats are for girls. The students obtaining a 'C' certificate are eligible for direct interview (without written exam) for entry into army services and are also given a weight age of 2% marks while applying for admission to Himachal Pradesh University courses.

IV. In addition, the college has rovers & rangers wing also.

RD RIBBON CLUB

Any number of college students can get registered as volunteers of this club which exclusively aims at launching an exhaustive campaign against AIDS, AIDS is not only a health issue but also an educational and social one. Hence, it makes the institution really proud as how this war against AIDS is gathering momentum year after year with the concerted efforts of young peer educators.

SPORTS & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The college provides optimum facilities for various games viz, Athletics, Volley- ball, Kho-Kho, Kabbadi, Boxing, Table-Tennis, Badminton, etc. Further, the college students successfully mark their presence in different events of Youth Festivals at Inter-College and Inter University level.

LIBRARY

There are about 3719 books in the college library. In addition to various Encyclopedias, reference books and general books, the library has a regular subscription of 05 Newspapers, 03 magazines and 01 periodicals. All students can have access to these during the special hours.

The following rules and regulations are to be observed in relation to library by the students.

- 1) Maintain silence in and around the library.
- 2) Always keep your Identity Card with you.
- 3) Due to large number of students, the days and timings of getting a book issued are fixed and displayed on library Notice Board.
- 4) U.G. students can borrow 2 books at a time for a period of 10 days.
- 5) Reference books (Encyclopedias, dictionaries etc.) will not be issued.
- 6) A book should not be spoiled by underlining or marking/writing comments on it. Keep in mind that the book is also to be used by other student of the college.
- 7) In case a loss of a book or any damage, the borrower will have to replace the book with a new copy at market value.
- 8) Over-date due & fine is Rs. 1/- per day.
- 9) College also provides Book Bank facility sponsored by PTA for the needy and desirous students.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

For the quality improvement of higher education, the college has an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). From time to time all important decisions pertaining to the betterment of the college as well as students are taken by the members of IQAC.

NAAC CELL

College has permanent NAAC Cell to regulate and manage all the NAAC affairs around the year. The cell is committed to strive for better accreditation in the future. Our institution has got accredited in the year 2019 with Grade "C".

EDUCATIONAL TOURS

1. Educational tours are arranged only during winter vacation.
2. Routes will be recommended by the concerned committee and approved by the Principal.
3. Students will have to produce the written permission from their parents for joining such tours.

REMEDIAL COACHING CELL

The college is recognized by UGC under section 2(f). So, the college is planning to establish a remedial coaching Centre to the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer), minorities/PD/BPL categories. General category students can also avail this facility. There shall be a remedial class by the end of every week (Saturday).

CSCA FUNCTION "JHANKAR"

The college CSCA along with the college administration organize the inter faculty cultural function for students to represent their faculties.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE "SHATRUPA"

To nourish the creativity among the students, the college magazine SHATRUPA is published every year. It has many sections like Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Pahari, Science and Commerce, Management & Planning . One student editor for each section is also appointed in the beginning of academic session.

CAREER GUIDANCE, COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL

The UGC formulated Career Guidance, Counselling and Placement Cell has been constituted in the college with an aim to prepare the students for job or self-reliance. The cell consists of a core committee and various faculty wise sub-committees which will undertake the various activities from time to time. The cell will provide the placement opportunities to students by facilitating various companies/private firms for conducting job programmes/tests/interviews etc.

ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION

Annual function of the college is organized in every year. In this function prizes are given to the students achieving distinction at college/university/inter university level in NSS, Ranger and Rovers, House examinations, university exams, sports and other co-curricular activities organized throughout the year.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION

This association has been working actively towards the improvement of the college infrastructure and provides assistance as per the requirements of the college.

TUTORIAL GROUPS

After the admission every student is made a member of a specific tutorial group convened by a teacher. According to the need and convenience of its students can discuss their academic and management related problems with the concerned teacher.

COLLEGE STUDENTS CENTRAL ASSOCIATION

This association is elected according to the rules and regulation of H.P. University besides maintaining discipline in the college, the SCA plays an important role in involving students in various co-curricular activities like seminars and functions at Intra and Inter-College level.

These scholarships are awarded to the students as per norms and rules prescribed by the department. The students should apply for these scholarships through an application recommended by the scholarship committee. Also, six scholarships in various categories are sponsored by the Basu Memorial, Barsar every year.

Note: - The date of submission of applications for these scholarships will be displayed on the notice board in due course.

PRIZES/AWARDS

Prizes are given to the students achieving distinction in house exams, University exams, excellence in sports, NSS/Rovers and Rangers/Red Ribbon Club and other co-curricular activities organized from time to time in the college, University and Inter-University level. These prizes are awarded in the annual function of the college organized in the month of February/March at the end every year.

TERM END EXAMINATION

1. To appear in university examination a student will have to fulfil 75% lecture condition (75% in theory and 75% in practical). The attendance will be counted from the first day of the commencement of teaching work/admission.
2. The MTT examinations will be conducted in the months of December in annual system. A student will have to obtain at least 35% marks in each subject to become eligible for appearing in University final examinations.
3. For the purpose of determining "Eligibility to appear in the University Examination," the existing provisions in the HPU ordinance shall continue to be adhered to as such.

OUR HEALTHY PRACTICES

Feed Back Appreciation: A 'Suggestion Box' is installed in the college campus or through college web site link <http://gcbarsar.ac.in/feedback.php> to invite the general advice, suggestions or information from the students about how good or useful the institutional work is and what measures can be adopted to make its functioning more meaningful, purposeful and result oriented.

ATTENDANCE:

- (i) 75% lecture attendance is compulsory for appearing in the University Exams.
- (ii) An irregular student or one who remains absent continuously for 10 days his/her name will be struck-off from the college rolls. If the name of a student is struck off twice then he/she will not be re-admitted in the college.
- (iii) A student is liable to pay all dues & fines as long as his/her name remains on the college rolls.
- (iv) The Principal reserves the right of expulsion/suspension of any student.

LEAVE RULES

- (i) Application for any kind of leave on the prescribed Performa should be submitted well in time.
- (ii) Leave up to three days will be sanctioned by the concerned subject teacher.
- (iii) Leave above three days up to six days will be sanctioned by the Head of Department. Leave for more than six days will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of concerned subject teacher.
- (iv) In case of a medical leave for a period of over six days the applicant must produce a medical certificate. Important **Note: Students participating in Inter-College competitions should note that the practice/rehearsal timings should be either before the classes (early morning) or after the classes (evening) because all such activities form a part, but not the substitute of academic studies.**

LIBRARY CUM IDENTITY CARD (I-CARD)

- I. Every student will be issued an identity card. Since I-Card is the only medium to identify/differentiate a bonafide college student from an outsider. Every student must always keep/carry it with him/her and must produce whenever required (during all working days, during examination and college function etc.) Otherwise, he/she will be considered an outsider and will be punished accordingly.
- II. In case the I-Card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued only after an FIR is registered with the nearest police station and an original copy thereof is appended with such request.
- III. Rs. 20/- is to be deposited for a duplicate identity card.

PROCEDURE FOR MAKING 'I-CARD'

After depositing admission fee & due every student shall get an I-Card from the college librarian on showing his/her fee receipt. After having affixed his/her own photograph and filled in all the entries in the I-Card, every student must get it duly signed by the respective senior tutor within one week from the date of admission positively.

GENERAL CONDUCT/DISCIPLINE RULES

1. **Any of the following activities will be considered a breach of discipline:**
 - a) Graffiti i.e. any sort of writing on the walls/black boards/rooms etc.
 - b) Damaging the college property.
 - c) Loitering about the corridors and causing disturbance to the classes.
 - d) Possessing drugs and smoking in the campus.
 - e) Bringing outsiders to the college.
 - f) Sticking any kind of bills/notices on the notice board without the prior permission of the Principal.
 - g) Creating any kind of violence in the campus.
 - h) Coming without I-Card in the college.
 - i) Ragging in any form.
 - j) Use of mobile phones by the students in and around the classrooms is strictly banned. Defaulters will be penalised.

Note: All students must note that Ragging inside/outside the college campus is a cognizable offence.

In case a student is found guilty of indiscipline in any activity in any manner, the college administration shall take appropriate action against such offenders.

Anti-Ragging/Indiscipline Rules

In order to have zero tolerance to ragging and its total elimination from the educational institutions, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its order dated 4th May 2001, 16th May 2007 and 11th Feb. 2009 has directed as here under:

1. Ragging is banned in the institution.
2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be Exemplary and Justifiable harsh.
3. Punishment for ragging includes:
 - i. Imprisonment/fine or both.
 - ii. Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
 - iii. Withholding scholarships or other benefits.
 - iv. Debarring from representation in events
 - v. Withholding of result
 - vi. Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.
4. In the hostels, the entry of seniors and outsiders shall be prohibited before and after specified hours of the day except under the authority or the persons in-charge (Warden or Hostel Superintendent)
5. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment shall be resorted to.
6. Character/migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have an entry apart from that of general conduct and behaviour to the effect whether the student had participated in ragging and in particular was punished for ragging.
7. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith.
